- 5. To ensure effective leadership and governance in the Trust Board, Local Governing Bodies, Executive Team and within each academy
- 6. To ensure a collaborative, challenging and professional environment in which all can thrive

Strategic Aim 3: Our Organisation

An efficient and effective organisation design with robust processes to ensure resources are deployed to good effect for the benefit of the children and young people in our care

Priorities

- 1. To ensure that a Trust-wide policy structure is in place which supports the aims of the Trust as well as ensuring compliance with regulatory requirements
- 2. To ensure al decisions are well informed and taken at the appropriate level and in accordance with the scheme of delegation
- 3. To secure high quality teaching and learning, employing innovative methods and leading broader thinking about learning ad curriculum through a research driven approach
- 4. To deliver a strong financial plan that secures a sustainable future
- 5. To ensure our physical environment has high impact on our pupils and low impact on our environment
- 6. To ensure the Trust digital infrastructure enables staff and pupils to work efficiently, safely, innovatively and creatively
